Considered to be the most significant figure in the history of the National Health Service, Aneurin Bevan stated in his July 1958, **NHS** 10th year anniversary speech that the first main concept of the institution was **to provide a comprehensive, free health service for all the people of the country at the time of need.**

He also stated that **the essence of a satisfactory health service is that the rich and the poor are treated alike, that poverty is not a disability and wealth is not advantaged.** On this it's 70th anniversary, these principles still hold true.
